## LUTHERAN BIBLE TRANSLATORS

Church buildings in Liberia are often open with no window panes. The sound of the service carries out and around the area. One day, a man stepped outside church after reading the lessons in the local language and met a woman who had heard the text from her nearby yard. "She was so excited because the words now held meaning for her. She had heard the readings before in English, but she could not understand what the words meant," according to a missionary serving there through Lutheran Bible Translators. "The Holy Spirit can work in peoples' hearts when they understand what God is trying to tell them. And when they understand they can pass it on to someone else, sharing the Word in their own language."

Lutheran Bible Translators serves so that everyone – regardless of language or culture – might have access to God's Word in their heart language, the language they grew up speaking and thoroughly understand. Yet hundreds of millions of people – speaking over 1,600 languages – still have not one word of translated Scripture.

When you partner in mission through Lutheran Bible Translators, you bring the life-changing Word of God to people who have never before had the opportunity to learn about God's purpose for us through Jesus Christ. As they read and hear Scripture in their heart languages, individuals, families, and communities experience a new world in which we serve a purpose larger than ourselves. Relationships are mended, lives transformed, families strengthened, the Church grows. And the assurance of the living presence of Jesus Christ brings joy, hope and peace.

Joseph, a participant in a retreat for the leaders of translation projects in Cameroon, remarked, "Before we leave this life, we should do something to leave for others. What is better than to leave the Word of God? And how best can we understand God's Word? By hearing it in our own languages!"

## Epistle Lesson

*Romans 6:1-11*

*Saint Paul describes Holy Baptism in terms of death and resurrection.*

<sup>1</sup>What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? <sup>2</sup>By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? <sup>3</sup>Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? <sup>4</sup>We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

<sup>5</sup>For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be

united with him in a resurrection like his. <sup>6</sup>We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. <sup>7</sup>For one who has died has been set free from sin. <sup>8</sup>Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. <sup>9</sup>We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. <sup>10</sup>For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. <sup>11</sup>So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

#### **Family Footnotes**

I recently read a devotion that talked about positioning ourselves to receive. It caused me to think about how I operate in my daily life. Let me share a sentence from that devotion, "Opportunities can only 'drop into your lap' if you position your lap where opportunities drop." There is some truth to that statement. Too often we think we have to be in the 'right place' at the 'right time', but to me, that focuses more on luck. I think that positioning ourselves to receive has nothing to do with luck; I think it is a conscious mindset, a prayerful ponderance. Each day we have a choice to resist or receive. Are we ready to receive all that God has for us? Am I truly listening to those around me as I go through my day? Maybe God has placed one of those people in my life to share something important with me or cause me to think about something in a different way. Am I in God's Word to receive what He has to say and then take action, or am I merely looking for motivation or inspiration? Motivation and inspiration are most certainly noteworthy and maybe even necessary things, but if that is all that I am looking for, then I am missing out on opportunities. Prayerfully position your hearts and minds to receive the many blessings that God has in store for you today! I know His generosity will blow you away! I love Paul's words in Ephesians as he professes and proclaims His risen Christ. Let Ephesians 3:14-20 be your prayer today. "...that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith...and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, that you may be filled with all the fullness of God." Ephesians 3:16, 17a & 19 (Thoughts taken from Lutheran Church Charities devotion "Position Yourself to Receive.")
